


Search and Filter in the Universal Search Window (USW)



The Universal Search Window (USW) is an updated Code Lookup window featured in numerous areas of MOIS.

Depending on your Lookup Settings through your Administration module, you will have access to multiple Code Systems and Reference Sets. You can select 'all' or 'clear' for both of these, or modify your search by checking off different selections here. You can also enter additional search parameters but your results will be based on what Code Systems and Reference Sets are 'available' (checked off) for the search. For example, if you do not have ICD9 selected as your available Code System, and you try searching for an ICD9 code, *it will not show up even if the code/description you entered is correct*. Other parameters include active/inactive code status and 'category' such as 'Diagnosis' or 'Clinical Finding'.

By clicking on the ellipsis beside the Search button, you can clear your search history from this window and search by Term/Code. You can also click on the drop down menu next to 'Search' to see your most recently searched items.

Hot keys for this window include F6 which will jump the focus through each section (i.e. from 'Code Systems' to 'Reference Sets' to 'Parameters' and to your 'Search For:' field). You can also tab through the fields in this window and it will either highlight or bold the section you are currently in.

You can also use the Esc key to clear the search field; select Esc a second time to close the search window. Alternatively, if the search field is already blank, selecting Esc once will close this window.

Tips:

The new Alternate Terms box in the Universal Search Window shows you Synonyms for your selection (Preferred and Alternate) and FSN → Fully Specified Name. Searching for any of these terms will result in finding the same code.

You can also add your own Alternate Terms! This is done through the Administration module: Administration → Codeset Management → Codes

This is similar to the 'snippets' function in previous versions of MOIS and assists in faster searching as well as quick coding when adding a new row in the Patient Chart.
